First Reading Jeremiah 2:4-13

New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)

⁴Hear the word of the Lord. O house of Jacob, and all the families of the house of Israel. ⁵ Thus says the Lord: What wrong did your ancestors find in me that they went far from me and went after worthless things and became worthless themselves? ⁶ They did not say, "Where is the Lord, who brought us up from the land of Egypt, who led us in the wilderness, in a land of deserts and pits, in a land of drought and deep darkness, in a land that no one passes through, where no one lives?" ⁷I brought you into a plentiful land to eat its fruits and its good things. But when you entered you defiled my land and made my heritage an abomination. 8 The priests did not say, "Where is the Lord?" Those who handle the law did not know me: the rulers transgressed against me; the prophets prophesied by Baal and went after things that do not profit. ⁹ Therefore once more I accuse you, says the Lord, and I accuse your children's children. ¹⁰ Cross to the coasts of Cyprus and look; send to Kedar and examine with care; see if there has ever been such a thing. ¹¹ Has a nation changed its gods, even though they are no gods? But my people have changed their glory for something that does not profit. ¹² Be appalled, O heavens, at this; be shocked; be utterly desolate, says the Lord, ¹³ for my people have committed two evils: they have forsaken me, the fountain of living water, and dug out cisterns for themselves, cracked cisterns that can hold no water.

Sing aloud to God our strength; shout for joy to the God of Jacob. ¹⁰ I am the Lord your God, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt. Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it. ¹¹ "But my people did not listen to my voice; Israel would not submit to me. ¹² So I gave them over to their stubborn hearts, to follow their own counsels. ¹³ O that my people would listen to me, that Israel would walk in my ways! ¹⁴ Then I would quickly subdue their enemies and turn my hand against their foes. ¹⁵ Those who hate the Lord would cringe before him, and their doom would last forever. ¹⁶ I would feed you with the finest of the wheat, and with honey from the rock I would satisfy you."
